Level 2

For fencers having completed a beginners course

Athletes are advanced to group 3 on coaches recommendation.

MASK and GLOVE will need to be purchased or rented.

Fencers who started prior in the Fall of 2008 or before need their own gear.

Level 3

For fencers having fenced a few sessions and have the required age and/or experience. Placement by coach recommendation.

Equipment for electric fencing is responsibility of participants (jacket, wire, epee)

Bouting (for the season)

Monday fencing on electric machines

Equipment for electric fencing is responsibility of participants (jacket and sous-plastron/under arm protector, wire, epee, and mask)

1. Beginners (Level I) - initial introduction. Equipment provided

2. Level II

First season

mask/jacket/glove/under-arm protector can be rented or purchased

Second season - equipment should be purchased

3. Level 3 and Open bouting

All equipment for training is the responsibility of the athlete

4. Competitions (Alberta Fencing require breeches, 2 body wires and two weapons in addition to practice equipment.

Which Group should I be in?

The coaches will place you in a group. There , hence some people will be placed in group 3 shortly after completing a beginners group, or by-pass level 2 altogether according to age, maturity. Some skilled fencers will stay in group 2 for some time to remain with their peer-group. Everyone is encouraged to fence on “bouting night” to socialize and apply skills from the class.

Refunds
